64th INTERNATIONAL JAZZ IN JUAN FESTIVAL 10-20 July 2025 Pinède Gould, Juan-les-Pins

From 10th to 20th July 2025, Jazz in Juan will have the inspiring setting of the Gould pine grove resounding with jazz notes, the festival remaining true to its heritage of musical diversity and discovery of new talents. The 2025 programme is very varied, featuring great names from the jazz scene as well as talented electro artists and young artists.

The soul of Jazz in Juan lies in sharing, when internationally renowned artists and the public come together in the spirit of exchange and conviviality. With a capacity of 3,000 seats, which gives the festival its intimate and exclusive nature, each concert is an invitation to encounter and discover, in the exceptional setting for comfortable listening that is the Gould pine grove.

Antibes Juan-les-Pins, where jazz in Europe originated, will be resonating all summer to the sounds of jazz in all its forms, in particular by way of the free *Jammin'Summer Session* concerts which are a platform for meetings and creative freedom, offering a unique playing field for emerging artists. Also during the festival period, Marching Bands will take over the streets of the city while "Le Before" sessions within the festival will offer DJ sets and fun moments such as games of bowls.

Since its creation in 1960 – as a tribute to Sidney Bechet – Jazz in Juan has maintained its open and developing character over the decades. It would be difficult to list all the artists who have left their mark on the unique setting of the Gould pine grove, leaving not just musical memories but also their handprints. And so visitors can discover these lasting traces set in the pavements of boulevard Édouard Baudoin, which runs alongside Pinède Gould.

Jazz in Juan is something to experience at every moment, under the stars of the Gould pine grove, in the cafés, bars, restaurants, hotels and at the heart of the lively streets of Antibes and Juan-les-Pins. The festival can be passed on, shared and relished by solo festivalgoers, among friends and as a family.

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EMILE LONDONIEN

Emile Londonien presents a second album entitled *Inwards*. This project marks the band's growth and development, with subtle references to British jazz and established artists such as Ashley Henry, CHERISE and Kazy Lambist.

They also continue to position themselves as leading figures of the new French jazz scene, inviting prestigious artists to perform on the album including Laurent Bardainne, Jowee Omicil and Léon Phal.

Once again, Emile Londonien demonstrates his surprising ability to combine broken beat, house, jazz and R'n'B in a most singular way.

AIR

Two students of astrophysics and architecture walk into a bar on the moon. This sounds like the beginning of a joke — but in the waning light of the 20th century, it really happened, leaving a serious imprint on pop culture.

On January 16th 1998, AIR released *Moon Safari*, an album which catapulted Nicolas Godin and Jean-Benoît Dunckel to the uppermost rung of electronic music's ladder.

25 years on, it's not hard to alight upon why *Moon Safari* has stood the test of time. AIR's masterful rhythmics and atmosphere, the band's precision of execution and its exhilarating melodies have carried the group to posterity.

In 2024, AIR performed *Moon Safari* live for the first time ever, during a world tour.





DIANNE REEVES

Five-time Grammy winner Dianne Reeves is the preeminent jazz vocalist in the world. As a result of her breathtaking virtuosity, improvisational prowess, and unique jazz and R'n'B stylings, Reeves received the Grammy for Best Jazz Vocal Performance for three consecutive recordings – a Grammy first in any vocal category.

Featured in George Clooney's six-time Academy Award nominated *Good Night*, and *Good Luck*, Reeves won the Best Jazz Vocal Grammy for the film's soundtrack. Reeves' most recent release *Beautiful Life*, features Gregory Porter, Robert Glasper, Lalah Hathaway and Esperanza Spalding. Produced by Terri Lyne Carrington, *Beautiful Life* won the 2015 Grammy for Best Jazz Vocal Performance.

Reeves is the recipient of honorary doctorates from the Berklee College of Music and the Juilliard School. In 2018 the National Endowment for the Arts designated Reeves a Jazz Master – the highest honor the United States bestows on jazz artists.

JAMIE CULLUM

Jamie Cullum is a globally acclaimed singer, songwriter, and multi-instrumentalist known for his unique blend of jazz, pop, and rock. Most famous for his dynamic stage presence and prodigious musical talent, Cullum first came to prominence with his major label breakthrough *Twentysomething* whose multi-million sales make it one of the UK's best-selling albums of all time.

Jamie continues to win over audiences worldwide, earning a reputation as one of the most versatile and innovative musicians of his generation. His legendary concert performances have seen him tour over forty countries and grace the stages of festivals from Glastonbury to Coachella to Fuji Rock in Japan.

Amongst his proudest achievements was winning the prestigious Ivor Novello Award for Best Song, one of the industry's highest achievements, and voted for by his fellow songwriters.


AYO

Singer, composer and performer, AYO is a rare artist whose smooth, powerful voice transports the listener from the very first notes. Born to a Nigerian father and a German mother, she draws on her roots in soul, folk and reggae to create a unique and vibrant sound. Revealed in 2006 with her album *Joyful* (over a million copies sold), AYO has established herself as a key figure on the music scene. Her raw talent and sincerity touch the hearts of an everwidening audience.

Since then, AYO has enjoyed a string of successes, with albums such as *Gravity at Last* (2008), *Billie-Eve* (2011), *Ticket to the World* (2013) and *Royal* (2020). Each of her albums is an invitation to an intense musical journey, where emotions mingle with spellbinding melodies.

An accomplished artist and insatiable traveller, AYO unveils her seventh album, *Mami Wata*, inspired by her move to Tahiti. A powerful, introspective album, it marks a new chapter in the artist's career.

BEN HARPER & THE INNOCENT CRIMINALS

Ben Harper, born in 1969, is a versatile songwriter, steering his way between pop, reggae, soul, blues and rock. He has recorded 18 albums studio and sold over 16 million records, winning three Grammy Awards.

He has worked with many artists, including Harry Styles, Keith Richards and Pearl Jam, and written for the likes of Mavis Staples and Taj Mahal. Socially committed, in 2023 he was nominated for a Grammy Special Merit Award.

His latest album, *Wide Open Light* (2023), includes a duet with Jack Johnson. It followed up the album *Bloodline Maintenance*, nominated for the Grammy Awards for its political and personal revelations, fearlessness and soulfulness.

XU QUINTET

The creative project led by the twin brothers Zhihan Xu and Zhitong Xu, with contributions from numerous renowned jazz musicians, fuses different artistic cultures to explore the meaning of life.

In the face of absurd realities, their music becomes a way of creating more choices and illuminating the darkness. Zhitong Xu, jazz drummer, is known for his powerful performances and his influence on the Chinese jazz scene. Zhihan Xu is a guitarist and composer and teaches at Xinghai Conservatory. He draws inspiration from European jazz and directs the jazz orchestra Zhi Han Xu.

MARION RAMPAL

Marion Rampal a singer and composer born in Marseille, fuses African-American traditions and Western classical roots.

Her musical career has led her from jazz to song, with a universe inspired by artists such as Fiona Apple, Patti Smith and Blind Jefferson. Working with figures including Archie Shepp, she reinvents song by way of her album *Oizel*.

Winner of a Victoire du Jazz 2022 in the category "Vocal Artist", she wins over the audience with her unique voice and refined compositions. In residence at Théâtre de Coutances in 2024, she performed at Café de la Danse in April 2024, then returned to Paris at Théâtre Athénée last January.


MACHA GHARIBIAN

A pianist with a delicate touch, singer, songwriter, composer, arranger and producer of her own albums, it was while experiencing jazz in New York that Macha Gharibian began to create her own universe, blended with the mark of her three cultures.

Macha is Armenian through her ancestors, Parisian by way of where she lives and has the experiences of a New Yorker. Her personal style and crossover place her in the landscape of unclassifiable music with a very distinctive sound, somewhere between oriental, neo-classical and adventurous pop jazz.

Her musical heritage has come to her from her father, a guitarist and singer, cofounder of the legendary band BRATSCH. Her fourth album *Phenomenal Women* was released in January 2025.





MARK LETTIERI GROUP

Well known for his tight and agressive rhythmic play, be it at the service of Snarky Puppy, winner of a Grammy Award, the Fearless Flyers or on his six solo albums, guitarist Mark Lettieri has found the perfect formula for funk.

Merging influences from rhythmic guitar icons of the 70s and 80s such as Prince and Nile Rodgers, with inspirations from James Brown, George Clinton and P-Funk, Stevie Wonder, the Brothers Johnson, Rufus & Chaka Khan and more, this resident of Fort Worth, in Texas, has been slipping his razor edge into the consciousness of funkaters ever since he joined Snarky Puppy in 2008.

ROBERT PLANT PRESENTS SAVING GRACE feat SUZI DIAN

Robert Plant, a living music legend will perform at the Gould pine grove with his band Saving Grace.

The five musicians work in glorious harmony from start to finish reworking a selection of diverse cover versions that have been collected from around the globe.

With Westerners at his side who always hit the mark, the dashing Robert Plant has continued to surpass himself and astound audiences with Saving Grace since 2019. The formation includes the veterans Tony Kelsey and Matt Worley, as well as percussionist Oli Jefferson and the sensational singer Suzi Dian.

This extraordinary band presents to the audience a fascinating combination of traditional and contemporary sounds, songs which reflect Plant's varied influences and tastes. There are elements of British and American folk music, spiritual and Americana blues, creating a complex alchemy of sound in which acoustic guitars, the banjo and the mandolin blend harmoniously with the percussion instruments.





MESHELL NDEGEOCELLO

Meshell Ndegeocello pays tribute to the writer James Baldwin with her album No More Water: The Gospel Of James Baldwin, which explores the themes of race, sexuality, religion and oppression, present in Baldwin's works. The album was inspired by Baldwin's essay The Fire Next Time and addresses profound subjects, in particular racism and family heritage. Co-produced with Chris Bruce, it has brought together several musicians, including Justin Hicks and Josh Johnson. The album combines diverse musical influences, ranging from jazz to African music, and includes performances by poets such as Staceyann Chin and Hilton Als. Each song is a reflection on the struggle against injustice, with an introspective and committed approach. Tracks such as "Raise The Roof" and "The Price of a Ticket" are calls for resistance in the face of systemic racism.

Ndegeocello, inspired by Baldwin, also speaks of her own path as a queer, black woman and of the quest for unity and The album understanding. resonates with Baldwin's speeches powerfully on truth, love and the struggle against oppression. This is the opportunity for Meshell Ndegeocello to perform at the Gould pine grove in Juan-les-Pins, so close to Saint-Paul-de-Vence where James Baldwin lived and where he passed away in 1987.

GREGORY PORTER

A feast for the ears, bringing balm to the heart and comforting the soul: here is *Still Rising*, Gregory Porter's latest album, which presents a retrospective of his career since 2010. This project brings together his greatest hits, works with legendary artists such as Nat King Cole, Ella Fitzgerald, as well as duets with Moby, Paloma Faith and many others. Porter, whose career began rather late in life, continues to reinvent himself with completely new tracks which echo his optimism and his vision of love.

The album is a tribute to his personal experiences, marked by challenges, including the loss of his mother and his brother. Porter expresses himself on the importance of love, of optimism in the face of adversity and of spiritual elevation.

Songs such as "I Will" and "Dry Bone" embody this spirit of resilience and joy. Still Rising stands out for its musical diversity, ranging from jazz to soul, and for its unique collaborations, in particular with opera and jazz stars. Porter is delighted with his international career and his parallel projects, such as his podcast and culinary series. This dual action celebrated his development and his birthday, marking an important stage in his artistic and personal life.

KAREEN GUIOCK THURAM

Kareen Guiock Thuram, one voice, two passions, two careers: music and journalism.

She was always a singer and after 10 years at the head of TV programme 12:45, then managing the programmes 66 MINUTES and 66 MINUTES GRAND FORMAT on channel M6, in 2023 she released her first album *Nina*, a tribute to the immense Nina Simone, reinterpreting her classics with emotion, sincerity and simplicity.

Nina Simone, whom she met during her teens, embodies for her a model of strength, struggle and class and was to have a powerful influence on her own story. With this tribute to Nina Simone, Kareen Guiock Thuram explores the most intimate side of her journey. Far from wanting to imitate the legend, she draws deep inspiration from the artist, whose personal and artistic journey fuels her own.

Twenty years after Nina Simone's death, her heritage lives on, passed on and enhanced by a new voice (hailed by critics and the public, with sold-out concerts throughout the land and many prestigious festivals), like the handover of a torch.

* THE TRUMPETS OF MICHEL-ANGE


Ibrahim Maalouf is back big time with his 17th album. Just as much in terms of philosophy as history, *T.O.M.A*, which stands for Trumpets Of Michel-Ange, is a great musical adventure transporting listeners to a world where folklore and modernity and rolled into one. As is his habit, Ibrahim aims to create music both demanding and accessible to the general public.

T.O.M.A is first and foremost an album of mixed sources, a real blend of influences on which the festive and nostalgic East is expressed with rare freedom. T.O.M.A is also a trumpet brand name, created by Ibrahim together with French manufacturers. It is on this instrument, one of a kind in the world, invented more than half a century ago by his father, that Ibrahim performs on stage and on which he now teaches the new generation of trumpeters. Finally, T.O.M.A is a big party which unites all generations, enthusiasts and professionals, and guests!

With *T.O.M.A*, Ibrahim lays the first stone of an ambitious life project combining lutemaking, French cultural diversity, teaching, album, the stage, and which aims above all to assemble just as many common values.

DABEULL


Behind his look, like that of an actor from the 1970s-1980s, there hides a artist who has gained international recognition as the torchbearer of funk.

Immersed in zouk and African sounds, Dabeull has managed to breathe modernity into an authentic sound, warm and entirely produced with synthesisers from the 1970s.

With his analogue live band, his musicians dressed in period costumes and his vintage synths, Dabeull offers a one-ways ticket to the 1970s-1980s!

His original vision and his quirky charisma enable him to reach an ever-wider audience.

CARAVAN PALACE

The first extract of their fifth album released in spring 2024, Caravan Palace reveals the single *MAD*: a driving and exalting blend of vintage and electronic sounds. This unusual and unique musical cocktail which borrows from jazz and swing of the Roaring Twenties, has brought them international success which continues to develop and gain confirmation with each of their album releases, world tours and clips in a crazy and addictive universe.

In this way, within the space of ten or so years, the band has passed from the status of a live sensation on the Parisian scene to that of a pop phenomenon making an international buzz. Their stats are giddying: 2 billion streams on YouTube, 800.000 million on Spotify... They are one of the very few French bands to have been awarded a platinum disk in the United States.

On stage, Caravan Palace changes into a wild sextet, capable of setting alight any concert hall or festival, from Coachella to Glastonbury, from Paléo to Rock en Seine. A return not to be missed!





SOPHYE SOLIVEAU

Sophye's vocal chords and those of her harp unite, rising against a background of graceful song and a bass-drum rhythm with a precious and subtle groove. A harmony further enhanced by an original repertoire deeply inspired by soul.

Passionate about vocal harmony, she puts her voice to the service of projets such as the Oshun choir and the Afrofeminist singing group Maré Mananga.

Collective creation as well as improvisation and involving the body in working the voice and the music are the very essence of her approach with the different vocal ensembles that she accompanies.

Sophye Soliveau often performs with the audience, which she transforms into a giant singing body. From there, collective magic emanates, merging with the power of her universe.

HERBIE HANCOCK


Herbie Hancock remains at the forefront of world culture, technology and music. A pianist and a legendary composer, Herbie Hancock has been an integral part of every popular music movement since the 1960s. As a member of the Miles Davis Quintet he contributed to a revolution in jazz, before creating iconic albums such as *Headhunters*, that combined electric jazz with funk and rock in an innovative style that continues to influence contemporary music.

Herbie Hancock also has an active career off the stage, as Creative Chair for Jazz for the Los Angeles Philharmonic Association and as Institute Chairman of the Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz. He is also a UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador, contributing to promote peace, culture and education through jazz and the arts.

Nicole Slack Jones, a songwriter hailing from New Orleans, has a voice which leaves no one indifferent. Powerful, vibrant, inhabited by the soul of gospel and the depths of the soul, she doesn't simply sing: she makes each note resound with rare intensity. It is not a promise, but a self-evident fact; simply hearing her brings understanding.

Immersed from childhood in the culture of sacred music, Nicole is descended from the greats: relative of the legendary Fats Domino, daughter of saxophonist Philip Slack Senior and choir leader Judy Slack, she grew up to the rhythm of gospel. In her family in the South of the United States, secular music had no place, but her veneration for Aretha Franklin, Whitney Houston and Deborah Cox led her to listen to them in secret.

As much as breathing, singing is a necessity for Nicole. Very quickly, her voice made her a sensation, first at school, then on the emblematic and legendary stages of New Orleans (New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival, Snug Harbor...).

Barely graduated, she released a first album, reinterpreting the greatest standards of Soul and Gospel. Since then, she has given more than 1,200 stage performances throughout the world, either as a main artist or in collaboration with other famed singers such as Stevie Wonder, Lionel Richie, Aloe Blacc, Zucchero, etc.

A committed humanist, Nicole Slack Jones celebrates freedom, unity and peace through her music. Each performance is a unique experience, a pause in time during which emotion comes to life. She is actively preparing her new album. Its release will be announced soon!

DJ JULIENFROM 10TH TO 12TH JULY

DJ and producer of Tropical Funk, Afro Soul and Jazz music since 1995, Julien Lebrun is also co-founder of the label HOT CASA Records, specialised in reediting and producing Afro-Funk music. A globe-trotter keen on finding rare disks, itw as in West Africa that he developed solid links with the producers and musicians of afrobeat and tropical soul. Resident DJ in China, Japon and New York, he devotes himself to sharing the bygone and current sounds of the underground Soul scenes. He has celebrated the 20th anniversary of his label, with more than 80 vinyl record releases of famous artists such as Vaudou Game, DjeuhDjoah & Lieutenant Nicholson, Florian Pellissier quintet and Orlando Julius, among others.



JEAN FROMAGEAU

FROM 15TH TO 16TH JULY

Jean Fromageau is the kind of enthusiast who lives music to the full. A journalist, radio host and DJ, he always has a disk to play and a story to tell. While his tastes are varied, jazz has a special place in his universe. No need to be a purist to enjoy it: he loves disks that breathe, that groove, that stray from the beaten path. A standard revisited, a bass guitar that flirts with hip-hop, a far-reaching solo... As long as it makes a noise, he's up for it. Behind the turntables, he dives randomly into all that, going from a hypnotic Coltrane melody to a beat modified on an MPC. His mixes reflect his vision of music: they are open, curious and always flexible. Be it on the radio, at a festival or behind the turntables, Jean Fromageau does what he knows best: delves, shares and above all has fun.



DJ OIL FROM 17TH TO 19TH JULY

Lionel Corsini, alias DJ Oil, is a producer, an author and a DJ from Marseille, who has been working in the field since 1988. Founder of the Troublemakers (Blue Note USA / R&S / Pias), he has sold over 300,000 albums and has also composed for film and television. His new project, Blind Voodoo, is the fruit of 10 years of work in Africa, where he collaborated with many musicians, in particular Niktus, the bassist of FFF. DJ Oil has also enhanced his career by travelling through over 40 countries and recording solo albums for labels such as BBE, Tangential Music et R&S. His musical style, eclectic and exploratory, mixes jazz, breaks, disco and electronic funk, for sets suitable for dancing, trance or attentive listening.

JAZZ IN JUAN IS COMMITTED TO RESPECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

Jazz in Juan is a member of COFEES, the collective of eco-friendly festivals supportive of the community in Région Sud.

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In 2024, the team collected 240 kg of organic waste, transformed into compost at a local platform in partnership with Univalom, as well as 3,000 cigarette butts destined to be recycled in collaboration with the non-profit organisation Project Rescue Ocean.

Aiming for zero waste, unbranded eco-cups were introduced in order to avoid any "collector" effect and favour their return, cleaning and reuse. Behind the scenes, the festival has also stopped the usage of disposable plates and cutlery and single-use containers.

The festival has also introduced a team of seasonal workers whose task is to raise awareness among spectators and remind them of the sorting guidelines.

In 2024, 9 non-profit organisations were present at the event, representing various themes:

- Raising awareness about biodiversity and the environment: with CEN PACA (Regional Conservation Agency for Natural Sites), la Fresque du Climat and the Municipal Environmental Department)
- Information on waste-sorting and the zero-waste goal (with Rescue Ocean and Univalom)
- The taking into account of social and societal issues (non-profit organisations Abrascadabra for premature babies and AVH for the visually impaired, as well as La jeune chambre économique helping young citizens bring about positive change and Kiwanis for children in need)
